I. WHAT IS PRAYER?

Pray - to speak to God in worship; to enter into spiritual communion with God; to ask earnestly from God, to entreat or beseech

Prayer - the act of praying; the thing prayed for; a form of worship

II. WHY DOES GOD WANT US TO PRAY?

This study gives us a biblical framework for understanding the basics of prayer. It is not meant to be exhaustive; hundreds, if not thousands, of books have been written on this subject. As with everything else when dealing with the Lord, the key to a successful prayer life is in maintaining our own personal freedom from sin, through Jesus Christ, and in our desire to walk with God in obedience and holiness. Without this, we can pray very fervently, very often and very long but without receiving the results God promises in his Word.
